The Housing Credit program was created as part of the Tax Reform Act of 1986. Today, the Housing Credit is widely regarded as the nation's most successful housing production program ever, resulting in the construction and rehabilitation of more than 2.6 million housing units for low- and moderate-income Americans. In addition to producing housing, the Credit also contributes to the revitalization of distressed low-income communities and creates needed jobs. It is estimated that building 100 multifamily units generates 122 local jobs during the first year of construction and 46 jobs every year thereafter.
